The residents are requesting speed bumps and are getting together a petition and will possibly come to the next council meeting to request this in person. Mr. Colville asked if Solicitor Urick could have current "speed bump" information for council to review and be prepared. He said he would send a memo to Mr. Kramer. Mr. D. Wilson added Corp. St. Clair is also back. Mayor Antoline concurred he came back October 2nd,

Managers' Report: Mr. Kramer was absent, therefore Pres. Booher read his report.

Streetscape: Bid is ready for advertisement and should be in this Sunday's paper. **Audit-** Mr. Kramer received Borough audit and will have to go over it with himself & Pres. Booher. **17th Street-** working with Penn Dot and Road crew to get manholes open for surveys to get completed. **Labor Position-** there are 2 positions open. No internal bids were turned in. Advertisements will go in paper now and interviews to follow. **LSA Grant-**working with KSA on this grant, due November 30th, for \$1millon dollars. **Budget meeting-** will be advertised for October 24th and meeting will be held at 6:00 p.m. council meeting to follow. **Paving Program-** Youngblood paving was in on Saturday to clean up loose gravel on Marhsall/Ridge Road. **Food Trucks**: Lastly, he mentioned there are some business owners in the downtown area inquiring about having Food trucks outside of their business, come 2024. Pres. Booher added this will probably be in the middle of Streetscape, but they can discuss it at a later date. There were no questions at this time.

<u>Solicitor's Report</u>: Solicitor Urick gave his report. Completed drafting for ROW agreements for the condo development and will send to Mr. Kramer when it's completed for review. Aside from some tax appeals, he does have some

conferences in the coming weeks but nothing else to report that are pending.

Department Report – Curt DiGiovine was not in attendance.

Pres. Booher added Curt had called the Community College as he is aware there is a course for sewer treatment that is now finishing up a class. Curt is asking the school if anyone finishing that class would be interested in applying for the sewer laborer position that is open. Mr. D. Wilson asked is this for an intern job. Pres. Booher said no, this would be Full-time sewer laborer. There were no further questions.
