Engineers Report: Mr. Tony Sadaka of Widmer Engineer gave his report.

<u>Minutes</u>- Mr. D. Wilson motioned to approve Council Meeting Minutes of September 13th, 2022. Second by Mr. McLaughlin. Motion carried unanimously.

<u>Fiscal and Contractual</u>- VP Shotter motioned to approve the monthly bills. Second by Mrs. Majors. Motion carried unanimously.

Manager Report- Mr. Kramer gave his report. Engineers meeting- Friday, major discussion was focused on the transmission line. He explained. Also, the plan with disinfection system and waiting for Dan Sell to get him information on that so those will be on future agendas to buy items ahead of time to get this out to bid. Fall Fest- We have plenty of baskets in the office ready to go for the raffle. Gabby's doing great job along with Angel getting park ready. He explained all that will be at the event. Road crew is even patching potholes and cleaning park up in advance. Last week, he got an email from DCED regarding application submittal of one million dollars for the Civic Center. He will have that submitted by Friday. He reiterated paving program details that Tony explained earlier in his report. Mr. Kramer explained they will be back October 10th to finish up Linden and Blaine and the rest of the program. Lastly, he did share with Councilmen Shotter and McLaughlin, being it's in their ward, that spring 2023, Columbia Gas is planning to replace a transmission line between Bechtel and S. Elm, a paper alley. They are in process now reaching out to residents notifying them of the work and restoration to be done when work is completed.

Mr. D. Wilson asked how the residents are being notified when streets are being paved. Mr. Kramer said Blaine and Linden received Push Notifications and we put info on website as well.

VP Shotter asked for a general update on design for Civic Center and next steps. Mr. Kramer said talking with Kevin, they will get their electrical engineers engaged based on the drawings they have. Kevin said he wants to talk with Tony about plumbing/water/sewer site prep to get that up and running. This could possibly go out to bid late winter, which best time is end of the year.

Borough Solicitors Report- Solicitor Urick gave his report. Last week, himself and Mr. Kramer attended a hearing which the court granted action on the Jackson Avenue property. They must wait 30 days for any possible appeals. If none, then they can close on the property. He announced they still need to close on Pacific Avenue property. He and VP Shotter discussed what was needed to complete the close, and VP Shotter said he will get with Solicitor Urick after meeting to discuss all. He had nothing further to report.

- 2. Mr. Michel motioned to approve quote from National Road Utility for Linden Street Waterline Project in the amount of \$7,343.49, for delivery and paid in 2023 (Budget Item Request). Second by Mr. Mitchell. Motion carried unanimously.
- 3. Mr. Michel **motioned** to approve quote from National Road Utility for Speyer and Bechtel Streets in the amount of \$17,238.80, for delivery and paid in 2023 (Budget Item Request). Second by Mr. D. Wilson. Motion carried unanimously.
- 4. Mr. Michel **motioned** to approve quote from National Road Utility for 6-inch waterline pipe for Linden & Speyer Avenue in the amount of \$26,010.00. Second by Mrs. Majors. Motion carried unanimously.
- 5. Mr. Mitchell **motioned** to approve quote from Secure Technical Solutions, Inc. for install camera system at the docks in the amount of \$7,517.00. Second by Mr. J. Wilson. Motion carried unanimously.
- 6. Mrs. Majors **motioned** to approve quote from Secure Technical Solutions, Inc. to install camera system at Water Department in the amount of \$6,437.00. Second by Mr. Yothers. Mr. D. Wilson asked if this is the pumphouse. Pres. Booher said that is correct. Motion carried unanimously.
- 7. Mr. Michel **motioned** to approve quote from Cleveland Brothers to restock Public Works items which include rubber pads, washers, and nuts in the total amount of \$5,136.80. Second by Mr. J. Wilson. Motion carried unanimously.
- 8. Mr. Michel **motioned** to approve purchase of 6 fire hydrants from Pipelines Inc in the amount of \$21,056.04. Second by Mr. Mitchell. Motion carried unanimously.
- 9. Mrs. Majors **motioned** to approve Monaca Monster Mash "Mad Dash" 5K Race Saturday, October 29th, 2022. Second by VP Shotter. Mr. D. Wilson asked if they were running the same route as they have in the past. Mr. Kramer said yes they are. Motion carried unanimously.

- -Mrs. Majors brought up the ideas for new mural for "Welcome Monaca" sign. Pres. Booher said this will be discussed at an upcoming workshop meeting.
- -VP Shotter thanked all those in the audience for attending the meeting that evening.
- -Mr. Michel said per the Engineers meeting, he wanted a better understanding as to why it is so important to order these materials now for public works department. Pres. Booher reiterated the hydrants are 56 weeks out as of now, which was discussed last meeting. Pres. Booher also confirmed they are locked into the prices if they order them now.

He explained his plan of action. Mr. Kramer said he will talk to them after the meeting to discuss the steps and what they need to do.
